

He was found on evaluation to have an acute anterior wall myocardial infarction in evolution. His chest pain was described as crushing and pressure like in character and rated at 10/10. Physical examination in the emergency room revealed a blood pressure of 150/105, Heart rate 88 and regular, chest clear to auscultation and percussion, cardiac exam with an impressive 3/6 mitral regurgitation murmur, plus S3, plus S4. EKG revealed an acute anterior wall MI. CPK and LDH cardiac isoenzymes were markedly elevated. The patient was admitted to coronary care unit and placed on the acute myocardial infarction treatment protocol. Intravenous Heparin, Morphine, and Urokinase were administered. The patient had prompt resolution of his pain and his EKG returned to baseline with anterior and inferior Q waves noted. CPK max was 2300 with 88% MB fraction.
